# First Face-to-Face Meeting of FORAGRO's New Assembly of Members Inter-American Institute for Cooperation on Agriculture San Isidro de Coronado, San José, Costa Rica, August 8 - 10, 2017

#### Background

The Forum of the Americas for Agriculture Research and Technology Development (FORAGRO) is the hemispheric mechanism for debate of an agreement on research and innovation issues affecting the agriculture and food industry of the Americas. A diversity of players in the hemispheric agriculture technology innovation system make up the Forum.

FORAGRO was established in 1997 by the resolution No. 327 of the Inter-American Board of agriculture (IABA), which also entrusted to IICA the establishment of a Secretariat to support the Forum. In 2003, through its resolution No. 398, the IABA again confirmed its support of the Forum.

In 2015, an external evaluation of FORAGRO was carried out which resulted in a series of recommendations on critical aspects of its operation and functions. In response, a restructuring proposal was developed to strengthen FORAGRO in order to make it more effective, sustainable and inclusive. This proposal was evaluated at the 16th meeting of the Executive Committee held in Turrialba, Costa Rica in November 2016 and general agreement was reached on the vision and mission of a renewed FORAGRO and on the next steps to implement the new model.

It was also agreed in Turrialba to take stock of achievements of FORAGRO as well as of the various agendas in agricultural research, technology development and innovation at the country and regional levels, with a view to identifying major themes of common interest to guide the Forum's future activities and prioritize its actions.

The first step towards the implementation of FORAGRO's new governance model is the constitution of an Assembly of Members with inclusive representation of the different groups of actors. The Assembly will have among its functions to adopt a statute for the Forum, choose representatives to a Steering Committee, and define the Forum's strategic direction.

#### Meeting objectives

Advance the implementation of the new governance model for FORAGRO by installing the Assembly of Members, discussing and approving a Charter, and beginning a process to put in place the proposed new structure.

Identify priority focus areas for FORAGRO and define next steps to develop a strategic plan to guide the actions of the Forum.

All this in order to move forward with a more sustainable, inclusive and effective FORAGRO able to enhance hemispheric cooperation to address challenges and opportunities through agricultural innovation.
